General Rules to keep you and our residents' healthy

- Do not visit when you are unwell
- Get your annual influenza vaccination
- If you have been sick, please wait to visit until you are free of symptoms for 48 hours

When to Hand Wash

Germs are invisible so hand washing is the best way to stop the spread. Wash your hands with soap and running water, or use hand sanitizer:

1. Before and after providing personal care to anyone
2. After using the toilet
3. After sneezing, coughing or blowing your nose
4. After handling garbage
5. Before preparing, serving and eating food
6. After removing gloves

How to Wash Your Hands

- When using hand sanitizer, use one or two pumps and then rub your hands together; touching all surfaces of your hands until dry (at least 15 seconds).
- When hands look or feel dirty such as when visibly soiled by body fluids, dirt or grease then
- Assist those who can't wash their own hands.
 - Wet hands with water, apply soap, and lather thoroughly for at least 15 seconds (sing Happy Birthday).
 - Rub between fingers, the backs on hands and wrists, finger tips and thumbs.
 - Rinse under running water; pat hands dry with paper towel.
 - Turn off tap with a clean paper towel.

Outbreaks

Outbreaks can happen in care facilities due to several different causes, such as:

- 1) Respiratory viruses like influenza
- 2) Diarrhea and vomiting ("gastro illness")
- 3) Antibiotic resistant organisms (MRSA, c-diff or other "super bugs")
- 4) Others

These infections can be spread easily, therefore to decrease risk to families and our residents and staff visits may be restricted

Group, social and rehabilitation activities may be cancelled.

Hair dressing may be cancelled

If your loved ones room is located on an outbreak unit, visit only in his/her room.

You may have to take special precautions if you visit eg: wear a gown or mask. Staff will advise you what is required.
