Then I was escorted out again afterward. I want to express my gratitude for this level of care...I wish every care facility took COVID precautions this seriously. Well done!"

The COVID-19 pandemic has served to highlight the fact that all of humanity is impacted by global events - especially those that have the potential to negatively influence our shared quality of life. Consequently, it is more important than ever that we commit to putting aside differences and embrace our common values, shared beliefs and collective desire to live in a world that is peaceful, vibrant, and healthy.
