The summary below outlines what families told us they feel matters most in: 1) maximizing their loved one's quality of life in our care homes; and 2) ensuring that our approaches to care aligns with the goals, vision and wishes of their loved ones.

Overall, what do families believe are the top four (4) most important and impactful things for their loved one to have a "good day":

- ♦ Caregivers
- ♦ Meals
- Medical Support & Allied Health
- ♦ Sleep/Rest

Overall, what do families believe are three (3) of the most important qualities of a caregiver who is responsible for caring for their loved one:

- Patience and empathy
- ♦ Knowledge of their loved one (individualized)
- ♦ Connection / relationship building ability/ listening skills

Overall, what do families believe are three (3) of the most important aspects for their loved one with respect to food:

- ♦ Taste/quality
- Nutritional content
- Ohoices at every meal and snacks

Overall, what do families believe are three (3) of the most important aspects of food service for their loved one:

- ♦ Variety of daily menu
- Service of staff
- ♦ Company / tablemates

Overall, what do families believe are three (3) types of engagement opportunities that are most important to their loved one:

- ♦ Social connection (1:1s, chatting with staff)
- Recreation activities on site
- ♦ Exercise / rehabilitation

Overall, what do families believe are three (3) of the most important aspects to ensuring their loved one gets needed rest/sleep:

- ♦ Comfort (pillows, blankets, temperature)
- ♦ Safety/feeling of security
- ♦ Noise levels

Overall, what do families believe are three (3) of the most important aspects in considering their loved one's physical environment:

- Cleanliness and laundry services
- ♦ Noise levels
- ♦ Temperature
